### Hoopla Now Live!

Our newest digital streaming service went live on December 2, during the snowstorm. Patrons have been extremely happy with the service and there does not seem to be a learning curve. Usage is already skyrocketing. Staff have noticed that several titles which are not available via Overdrive are available in Hoopla. This web and mobile library media streaming platform for audio books, comics, e-books, movies, music, and TV is only available for East Greenbush cardholders. Hoopla allows library patrons to download or stream media content. It will be a challenge to keep up with the demand based on our initial numbers.

### Winter Reading Challenge

The theme for this year's Adult Winter Reading Challenge is "Read the Library." We will have one regular game card available starting at 9am on January 3. Join in the fun for free and win prizes while "reading the library" with us!

### Phone System Project

The Phone System Update project is 95% complete. New phones were installed, and staff training implemented. We are waiting for the new speakers, and drive through window video camera to be installed. We have also added a new text messaging service for the winter weather closing process for staff, which was rolled out with the first storm of the season. Thank you to Karrie for helping to make sure that the install was unrolled as smoothly as possible. Our consultant is working with us on several punch-list items.

### Library Mascot Contest

Children were invited to submit an original design to replace Sully as the children's room mascot this fall. We received 38 submissions. A committee which consisted of staff and community members (3 staff, 2 teen volunteers, 1 member of the town board, 1 member of the Friends of the Library, and 1 family) reviewed submissions and narrowed it down to three finalists. The public will have an opportunity to vote for their favorite mascot between December 20 and January 5. The three final submissions are "Benji the Book Dinosaur," "Charlie the Elephant," and "Kiki of the Kids Room."

### Meeting Room eCommerce Project Update

Configuration for the meeting room eCommerce configuration project is in progress. This project is more complex than originally estimated and we are proceeding carefully to ensure a smooth roll-out. There are a lot of moving parts, and relationships involved, as well as staffing impacts. It looks like the new ETA is in February.

## Youth Services Report – November 2019

**Program Highlights:** 2 storytimes were cancelled due to EG school delays this month, and 2 other storytime sessions had extremely low attendance because of poor weather conditions. CMOST presented a program on animal habitats for an enthusiastic group at our monthly Homeschool Meet Up. The children had the opportunity to meet a turtle, a corn snake, and a bearded dragon. It was our most well-attended Homeschool Meet Up of the year, and we plan on bringing more educational programming from CMOST, Dyken Pond, and miSci to this group.

To reach working families, we continued to expand our weekend program offerings for children this month, holding 5 Saturday morning storytimes, and 4 Saturday afternoon programs for school-aged children. Our afternoon programs included a Comic Book Club with Jen, Thanksgiving crafts with Ariana, STEM activities with Sarah, and an author visit by Jodie Fitz, who read her book *Fidget Makes a Pizza*.

The LOOK (Loving Ourselves & Our Kids) program with the Pride Center has come to an end, with both parties agreeing that it had run its course. We hope to collaborate again with the Pride Center for future programming.

**Tween & Teens:** This month we had an after-hours Teen event on Friday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. 21 teens enjoyed pizza, crafts, and a digital scavenger hunt. It was well-received, and we plan on trying to hold one each quarter. Teen Room use has been steady after school, and this month there were 169 teens in the teen room during the 16 days librarians staffed the area. We also purchased 4 new Yogibo bean bag chairs for the teen room.

**1000 Books Before Kindergarten:** 3 new children registered for the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten program this November. 24 children checked in to record another 100 books read and 2 children finished the program this month.

**Meetings & Continuing Education:** Jen attended NYLA on Thursday, November 14<sup>th</sup> and attended the following sessions: *Uncovering Privilege & Addressing Microaggressions*, *Women’s Leadership Panel & Conquering Imposter Syndrome*, and *Behavior Management in Early Literacy Programs*. Jenna attended NYLA on Friday, November 15<sup>th</sup>, and attended the following sessions: *Queering Comics for All Ages*, *Enticing Escape Experiences for Your Library*, *LGBTQ+ Culture: Decoding the Alphabet Soup*, and *Planning Pop Culture Themed Festivals*.

## Technical Services Report – November 2019

The Cataloging Advisory Council met on the 7<sup>th</sup>. We discussed the possibility of expanding the number of material type codes. Until recently, we were restricted in Sierra to 30 different material types, but we now can have up to 200. These show up in the format column in Sierra along with its corresponding graphic and in Encore in the format column. Some catalogers have expressed a desire to add more formats mostly driven by expanding Library of Things collections. Some suggestions include Board games, Laptops, and Bakeware. I sent an email to the librarians asking for further suggestions.

I attended the Library Journal sponsored webinar, *Radically Rethinking Technical Services*, on the 12<sup>th</sup>. The focus of the presentation was how to reshape your thinking on the library users' experience and how to be responsive to your patrons' current needs.

I attended OCLC's Virtual AskQC (Ask Quality Control) webinar on the 13<sup>th</sup>. This month's topic was comparisons of searching in Connexion and WorldShare Record Manager.

I attended the hoopla training webinar on the 14<sup>th</sup>.

Kathy attended a NYSLAA executive council meeting in Baldwinsville on the 22<sup>nd</sup>.

## Digital Services Report – November 2019

### Online Presence:

- **Hoopla:**
  - Completed configuration and training. On track for launch December 2nd.
  - I was hoping to include Hoopla MARC records in the catalog, but UHLS didn't want records to things non-residents didn't have access to in the catalog.
  - Promotional materials (including lots of "Swag") arrived. Posters and flyers are available in the library, and promotion was done online through the website, Tech Tips blog, and social media.
- **Library Market Calendar:**
  - Discovered cancelled reservations continue to show on calendar as cancelled, but cancelled events do not show on the public calendar. Started a support ticket and advised staff to change event titles to reflect cancellation, but not change the actual event state.
  - Added "volunteer-led" to the list of internal categories.
  - Completed paperwork to aid in the configuration of our calendar to accept payment for meeting rooms.
  - They added iCal feeds which allows us to add custom calendars to Outlook.
  - They are working on a custom report for Susan that would save several steps in her formatting a standard report.
  - Identified formatting issues with reports are caused by cutting and pasting text from Word to events in the calendar. Word uses different markup for apostrophes and other diacritic characters that make them show incorrectly in reports exported from the calendar.
- **Social Media:**
  - Dlvr.it randomly republished a post from December 2016 about Flipster. Support stated that server issues where our blog is hosted (UHLS). Two days later, the UHLS server went down completely, supporting this theory.
- **Intranet:**
  - Susan created a "shared notes" library for staff to share info they get from trainings.
  - Met with Jill to discuss restructuring SharePoint (intranet) and integrating Teams for collaboration and OneDrive for sharing and backing up files. We are submitting it to a 3<sup>rd</sup> party tech firm to get a quote to create that new structure for us.
- **Websites:**
  - Changed the themes of Staff Picks and Tech Tips and updated outdated information. Using Staff Picks to test theme accessibility, speed, and an optimization.
  - Added a Hoopla page and post to the main website. Selena wrote a Tech Tips post. Both the post and page contain countdowns to launch.
  - InfiniteWP configuration hit a snag and I opened a support ticket to address it. When it is resolved, InfiniteWP will be fully configured.

- Was unable to update to the new Divi editor. Nathan made updates to the server that were recommended by Divi support staff, but that didn't help. Continuing to troubleshoot with Divi staff. On the bright side, the updates Nathan made to the server seem to have fixed the freezing issue we were having with the current editor.
- Working on a way to make sure traffic sent to both [eglibrary.org](http://eglibrary.org) and [eastgreenbushlibrary.org](http://eastgreenbushlibrary.org) get counted by Google Analytics.
- Gale page: Support uploaded our logo, but Webucator and NY Digital Heritage still do not have logos.
- Participated in a trial of Beanstack – prospective software for summer/winter reading programs.
- Established a new winter closing procedure that includes the new phone system, social media, calendar, website, and staff text notifications.

#### UHLS:

- Staff Picks and Tech Tips blogs went down from midnight to 9am on Monday 11/11.
- Changed our Transit receipts at the request of UHLS to simplify work for the new couriers.
- UHLS App: we continue to get complaints about the broken search feature. Our online resources page in the app was severely outdated. Opened a support ticket with UHLS and they updated it promptly.
- Worked with UHLS to allow both Hoopla and the event calendar to access Sierra to validate cardholders.
- Decision Center released an update with new reports available.

#### Library Computers/Hardware:

- New phone system was launched! This is just phase one. Future phases will include automatic closing announcements, speakers to amplify announcements in areas without phones, a speakerphone for the meeting rooms, a video doorbell at the book drop, and hosting the phone service in the cloud which includes channels for video conferencing.
- Ordered a wireless (Bluetooth) barcode scanner and wi-fi dongle to allow it to float between computers and be used at outreach events. Currently attached to Vicki's computer for use with Better World Books.
- Ordered 10 wireless hotspots to be circulated to patrons when policy and procedure are finalized.
- Holding on order of Square equipment to make sure we get the best setup for our situation.
- Purchased a Lifesize Share device. It will allow presenters to easily connect wireless devices to projectors and other displays.
- On 11/12, the staff copier displayed a message to shut down and unplug the machine until service could be contacted.
- In preparation for the Film Festival, Laurie purchased two tablet stands and a case so our staff tablets could be used to scan tickets for entrance. If you need to use a stand, they are on top of the staff goody box, and they are not in the catalog.
- Renewed Deep Freeze Standard support for our public laptops.

- Researched Grow with Google program and turned the materials over to Laurie for possible programming.
